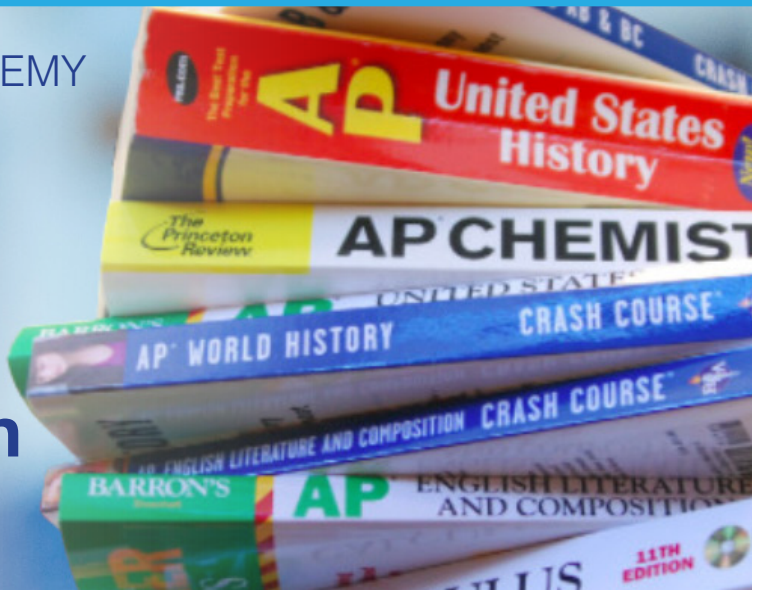




# 2024-2025 AP Class and Exam Information



Advanced Placement (AP) courses not only present challenging assignments but also provide an opportunity to earn college credit while in high school. Many major colleges and universities accept AP exam scores as evidence of competency and will grant college credit. Accepted exam scores vary by college.

## NRCA AP Requirements

General requirements for all AP classes (except for AP Psychology) include an A or B in the previous AP class or an A in the previous honors class of that same subject. Some AP classes carry additional requirements.

## Joining the AP Class on College Board

Students need to immediately join their AP class on the College Board as soon as the teacher gives them the join code. If the student already has a College Board account (typically created after taking the PSAT), they will sign in and follow the attached instructions. If not, they will need to create an account. They should NOT use their school email address when creating this account. If they already did so, they should sign in and change the email address to a personal one. If you need help getting into your account, call this VERY helpful College Board phone number: 888-225-5427. after you have tried everything--resetting your password, multiple email addresses, etc. **Do not create a new account if there is any chance you already have one!**

## AP Exam Registration

- Payment Deadline: **November 1, 2024**
- Total per exam (includes credit card fee): **\$102**
- Orders placed between November 1 and March 14 will incur an additional \$40 fee.
- No orders may be placed after March 14.
- Refunds will not be issued for canceled exams or to those who do not show up to take the exam.

The College Board sets the price and deadlines for AP exams. AP exams are optional and do not affect the student's grade in the class or GPA. Scoring well on the exam, however, may result in college credit. Please check with the individual institution(s) where you plan to apply to determine if specific exam scores are accepted for credit, and if so, how that credit would be applied.

**Self-Study:** Students who are not enrolled in the AP class may self-study and take an AP exam. Those who self-study will register for the exam in the same way as those taking the class. Be sure to designate self-study in the registration.

**Payment Deadline: Nov. 1**

**Please Note:** If you are uncertain whether you have ordered AP exams, do not go by what it says in the student's College Board account. First, check your email to see if you received a receipt from the NRCA business office for your payment. If you are still unsure, email Mrs. Etheridge. By default, the student's College Board account will say YES they will be taking the exam. Following the payment deadline, NRCA updates student accounts to say NO if the student did not order an exam.

# AP 2025 AP Exam Schedule

Please be certain of the date and time of your exam(s) prior to registration. While College Board does have a late exam option (also scheduled), NRCA policy allows for late exams only in the event of a conflict with school events (athletic tournaments, etc.) due to proctor and room constraints.

2025 AP exams will be digital. Students download the Bluebook app, know their College Board log in information, and bring an external keyboard and a backup battery. iPads must be fully charged and functional on exam day. Practice testing is available on the Bluebook app.
